

## Propose!

You are not required to have your proposed major in myUCSC listed as Technology and Information Management in order to declare the major. However, it is recommended.

Being a proposed major allows students to be connected to advising, receive important communications, and gain access to enrolling in some major courses that may be restricted to proposed majors.

## Qualify!

Complete 6 courses from the major qualification course lists with a grade of C or better no later than the end of your 5th quarter at UCSC to declare. At least one class must be from each group.

- **Group 1- Math group:**  
MATH 19A (20A), MATH 19B (20B), MATH 22 (23A), CMPE 16
- **Group 2- Engineering group:**  
CMPS 12A/L (or CMPE 13/L or CMPS 5J and CMPS 11\*), CMPS 12B/M, CMPE 12/L
- **Group 3 - ECON/TIM group:**  
ECON 1, ECON 2, ECON 10A, TIM 50

Have no more than one non-passing (below C) grade in major qualification courses. Repeating a class replaces the grade in your GPA but will still count toward the non-passing grade total.

Make sure to take all classes you are using for major requirements for a letter grade!

## Declare!

Declare your major no later than your 6th quarter at UCSC.

Deadlines are different within the Baskin School of Engineering! Be sure to visit the website and start the declaration process within the first 2 weeks of the quarter you are declaring!

*These major qualification requirements are intended for students entering UCSC as a first-time frosh student in 2018-19. Students admitted to UCSC as a transfer student must be admitted to the major at the time of admission to UCSC.*

*\*If CMPS 5J and CMPS 11 are taken to replace the CMPS 12A/L requirement, this will still only count as one class toward the 6 required major qualification courses.*
